I write to you on behalf of the children at Edmund Waller Primary School.

More specifically, on behalf of the school Climate Champions: a club of 24 children spanning Years 1-6 who take an active role in trying to help the school community minimise its impact on Global Heating, as well as protecting the area around the school community. They want to ask you for a pedestrian crossing over Lausanne Road due to its proximity to the school.

Small children cross this road regularly with their parents on the way to school and currently this is very difficult as cars drive down it quickly and visibility is very poor around parked vehicles. Many of our older children come to school without adult supervision and are finding the crossing stressful.

Next week, the whole school is taking part in a national challenge to encourage children all over the country to walk, bike or scoot to school. The Climate Champions have arranged this with the charity Sultrans. This initiative helped avoid over 1,300 tonnes of CO2 and just under 3,000 kg NOx emissions across the country last year. The Climate Champions are concerned because many of the children who partake will have to cross over Lausanne Road on foot, bikes or scooters. They would be very grateful if this were to have changed by next year's initiative.
