### Key achievements to date:

- The school's achievements in football have gone from strength-to-strength we are represented every week in the Lewisham leagues, with both boys and girls teams. For boys we have Y3/4, Y5 & a Y6 team. Both the Y3/4 + Y5 teams made it to their cup finals matches, with the Y6 team making the semi-finals.
- The Y3/4 team were overall league champions.
- The school's commitment to tackling gender bias remains undimmed we have an established Girls Team who made the Lewisham finals also. We have very well-established links with Girls United with a weekly coaching session on site. The team have also participated in numerous tournaments and events such as Toca Social.
- > The school has extended its offer of afterschool clubs with the creation of an after-school dance club (KS1 Thurs).
- ➤ We have begun to build links with local secondary schools recently participating in a Y5/6 tournament at St Thomas the Apostle College (STAC)
- > The school has continued to offer subsidised places and priority has been given to the PPG children and most vulnerable.
- > Swimming skills and attainment are consistently at a high level for Year 6 pupils.
- ➤ PE Curriculum has been completely resdesigned to reflect the whole schol approach pupil voice reflects the fact that there are are a range of new activities and skills being taught
- ➤ Dance, which was highlighted as an area for development, is taught by an external coach with a different year group being taught each term with teachers participating for their own CPD
- New enrichment lead has expanded offer and improved analysis of pupil participation.

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- Improve links with local clubs and secondary schools for pupils who express an interest or show potential to develop a sport further.
  This has started STAC link and further opportunities to participate in interschool tournaments schedule.
- > To increase participation of disadvantaged pupils in extra-curricular activities.
- New enrichment lead has targeted key families in a more strategic way
- Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) Lead to actively engage with key families
- > Embed the new PE curriculum
- PE Leads to continue a variety of CPD and monitoring activities (including staff & pupil voice) to identify areas for further support and development
