



A very happy new year to all our families, we trust you all had a restful break.

Mr Hill, arrived back to school to find two exciting letters awaiting him. The first was from our very own illustrious Prime Minister's office - a response to the children's letters, sent last term around the issue of climate change. You can see the letter for yourself here.

The second letter was a slightly tardy response from the British Museum. This letter was a response to last year's Year 6 children around the issue of the United Kingdom's continued custodianship of artefacts, which, it could be argued are a very long way from home! Although this letter took some time to arrive, it redeems itself by being a very thorough response, which shows that the author has spent some time reading the children's letters. The content is very much tailored to the points that the children made and will be of real interest to this year's Year 6 cohort as they begin their Africa topic this term. Have a read for yourself and see what the British Museum's position is regarding addressing the thorny subject of how artefacts from other countries remain in central London and not in their place of origin.
