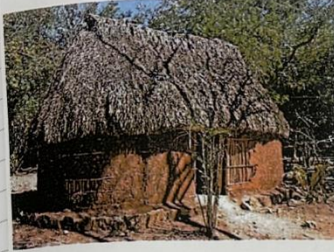

 one for cooking and living and bedroom!

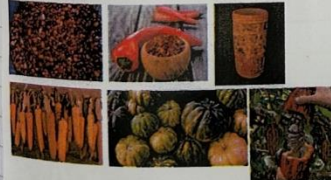

 - hay/plant's - from the area around the house
 The process was make the walls out of sticks and cover them with clay (mud).
 plant's (roof) when they were grown for to long the clay would crack and some time they would have a to mini burn for heat's.
 The Mayans built temples as well as houses. They are important because they would do sacrifices and worship there. The Mayan temples had 91 steps on each 4 points calculating 365 (about) steps. They do this because that the amount of clay's in there year (that many steps).
