


# Year 5 – Yendi

$$A = 45 + 16 = 61$$



And the highwayman on the pebbled road.





The Obas took over more and more villages and eventually made them into cities.




Ships from Portugal traded money with the Obas for precious goods, and the obas used this money for the army.
