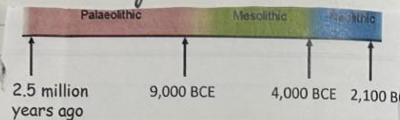
Walter Tull was a footballer

The stone age

The stone age began 2.5 million years ago. The stone age had three periods. The first one was called the Palaeolithic period, the second period is called the Mesolithic period and it started in 9,000 BCE, the third period was called the Neolithic period and it started in 4,000 BCE.

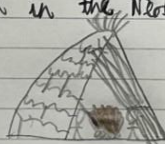


Hunter-gatherers to farmers

Stone age hunter-gatherers ate a diet that consisted of meat, fish and berries. Hunter-gatherers were known as Nomads which meant they never settled down.

Settlements

In the Palaeolithic period you would live in a teepee - covered with animal skins. If you lived in the Neolithic period you would live in a stone house with a thatched roof or you would live in a house made from wattle and daub.



The bronze age

The bronze age started in 2500 BC and it ended in 800 BC. In the bronze age an important metal was found... bronze! It was used to make tools and weapons. Huge copper mines were dug - in Wales and Ireland during the bronze age. The enormous Great Ore copper mine in Wales may have been the largest in the world. Men, women and children all worked in the mines, crawling along dark, cramped tunnels to reach the precious metals.

Tools and weapons

In the bronze age and iron age tools and weapons were very important. There was more fighting between tribes because the tribes had stronger weapons to fight with.

Stonehenge

Stonehenge is one of the world's most famous monuments. It stands on Salisbury Plain in Wiltshire and its giant stones can be seen from miles around. It took many years to build starting from around 3000 BC.

The Iron age

In the Iron age an important metal was discovered... Iron! Iron was of the most importance when it came to tools and weapons. It was used to make bigger and stronger weapons than bronze ones.

Homes in the Iron age

If you were a child in the Iron age you would probably have lived in a roundhouse, similar to a bronze age home. Your house was built of wood, covered with clay and animal dung with a thatched cone shaped roof. Hill-forts were built on hills because they were easier to defend. They were surrounded by ditches and banks of earth to keep the attackers out. Some hill-forts had villages inside and formed important trade centres. Others were used as hiding places in wartime. If you lived in Scotland or Ireland, your home might have been a crannog. A crannog was a human-made island, built of stone and wood on a lake or the edge of a marsh.
