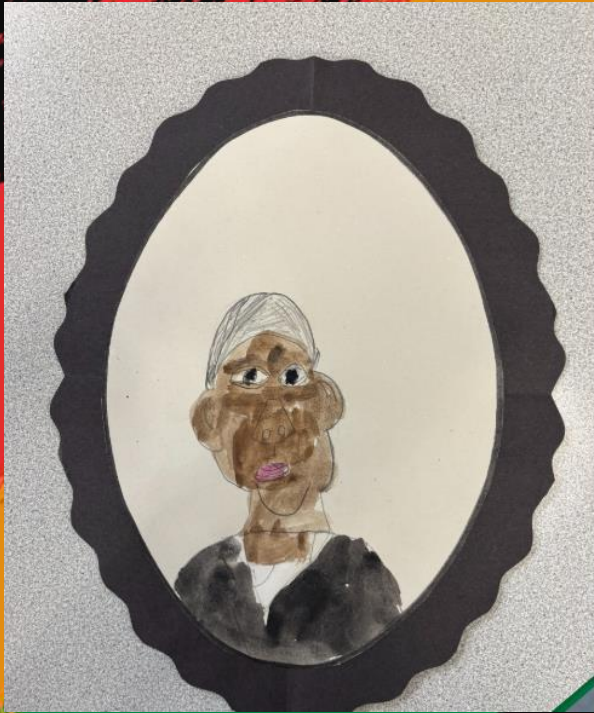

Ina Sarah Forbes Bonetta — Queen Vic's God-daughter



Sadly, Ina Sarah Forbes Bonetta died 2 weeks ago, leaving her husband and 4 children. She died of a lung disease called Tuberculosis at age 37. So now, we shall tell her extraordinary life. Sarah was born in 1844 in West Africa, Nigeria. Her parents

had died and she was taken to England by boat. The boat was called HMS Bonetta and the captain's name was Forbes so her name became Sarah Forbes Bonetta. When Ina arrived Queen Victoria took her in. Ina learnt many things. She loved writing, reading, learning new languages

and she especially loved to music. Her favourite instrument was the piano and she was great at it. She was married (reluctantly) to a black guy man called James Pinson Labulo Panos. They together had 4 children; Victoria, Arthur, Alice and Stella. Ina was a great role model and we're devastated that she is gone. We all shall remember her forever.
