Fish are cold-blooded and lay eggs. They use gills to breathe under water, and sometimes they have scales.

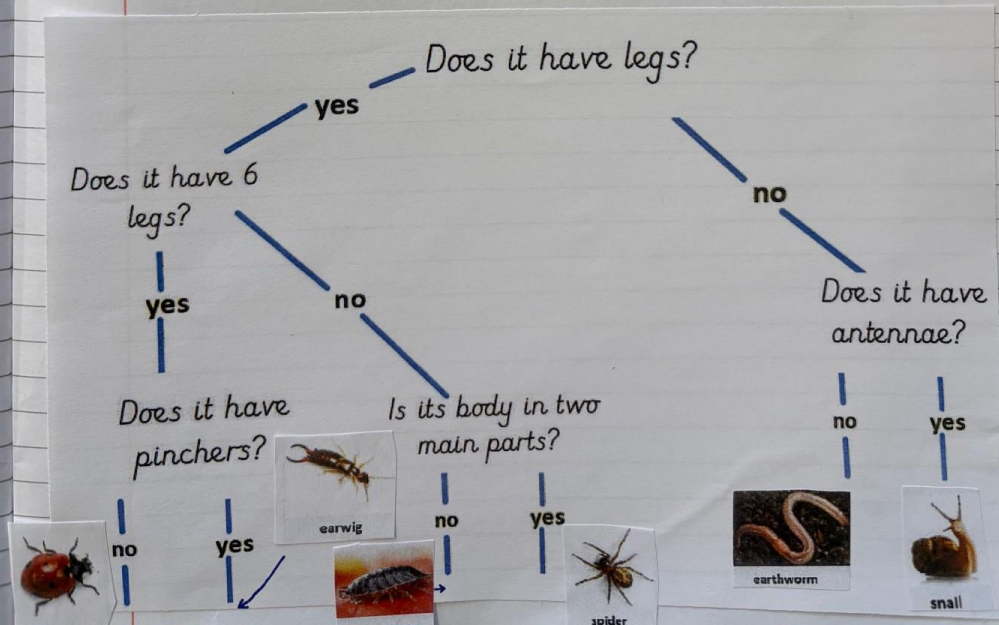
Mammals
